

MEDICAL/AYUSH AND ATTENDANT (M-1/M-3 and M-2/M-4) VISA

Please Note:

- Application for Medical/Ayush and Attendant Visa should be made at least four weeks before the planned date of travel (except in cases where emergency medical care is needed).
- A maximum of only two persons are allowed to accompany the patient as attendants.
- Minor children accompanying a parent intending to visit India for medical treatment on an M-1/M-3 Visa, shall apply for Miscellaneous Visa – X-Misc.
- Foreign nationals travelling on M-1/M-2/M-3/M-4 visas valid for a period exceeding 180 days, will be required to get themselves registered with the concerned FRRO/FRO within 14 days of arrival in India.
- Fees once paid will NOT be refunded.
- Consulate reserves the right to deny visa to the applicant without assigning any reason.

LIST OF DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR A MEDICAL/AYUSH AND ATTENDANT VISA:

1. Visa Application form filled and submitted online at <https://indianvisaonline.gov.in/>
2. Two photos of size 5cmx5cm with white/light background
3. Original foreign passport valid for a minimum of 6 months and having at least 3 blank visa pages.
4. Proof of reservation of accommodation or friend's/relative's address in India along with their valid ID proof. In case the stay is with a friend/relative, please ask the host to send a confirmation to cons.reunion@mea.gov.in along with their Indian ID proof that the applicant will be staying with them.
5. Medical documents establishing the need for taking medical treatment in India i.e. [supporting letter from an accredited Medical/Ayush Institution where the visitor will be treated and prescription/medical history document

necessitating the treatment duly stamped by the concerned hospital of the foreigner's country of origin or country of domicile.

6. Hospital Authorities must share the medical documents issued by them recommending the issuance of a medical visa e.g. medical invitation letter, appointment letter etc. as per the [attached format](#). These documents should be sent by the hospital directly to the email ID of the Consular Officer (cons.reunion@mea.gov.in in case of CGI, Saint Denis). Each applicant regardless of type of visa i.e. M-1/M-2/M-3/M-4 would require a separate invitation letter generated on the Medical and Ayush Visa Portal.

Note: Every Medical Invitation letter should bear a unique reference number, generated by the concerned medical service provider (doctor/hospital/clinic).

7. Last three months' bank statement as proof of sufficient funds to meet the medical and other expenses in India.
8. Confirmed return flight tickets
9. The above listed documents and rules are only indicative. Consulate may contact the applicants for any additional documents that may be required to process the application. Please use a valid and working email ID and telephone number.
10. Visa services depend on several factors including residency of the applicant. The Consulate General of India in Reunion Island reserves the right to take the final decision on any application which will be binding on the applicant.
